The *Anthony J. Sisti Papers* were donated to the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library in October of 2012 by art curator and writer David F. Martin of Seattle (originally from Niagara Falls, NY).

Biographical Note

Tony Sisti was a boxer turned painter, portraitist, and muralist. Born in 1901 in Greenwich Village, NY, Sisti moved to Buffalo in 1911, where he lived most of his life. Artistically inclined at young age, he attended classes at the Albright Art School. At 17, Sisti began boxing, and by 18, he won the New York State amateur bantamweight title. During his professional boxing career, Sisti won 76 victories in 101 fights.

At 23, Sisti married Carmella Leone and had a daughter soon after. In 1925, he traveled to Florence, Italy and studied painting under Felice Carena; he received his Doctor of Arts degree in 1929. In Italy, Sisti continued his boxing career, participating in bouts and training young

boxers. He also attended art classes in Paris and Munich, studied anatomy at St. Mary's Hospital in Florence under anatomist Chirugi, and painted a portrait of Guglielmo Marconi.

Sisti returned to Buffalo and taught drawing and anatomy at the Art Institute of Buffalo from 1932 to 1938. He also established his own studio at Main and Summer St., later located at Main and Utica. In 1934, he was one of the first artists to paint a mural under the Works Project Administration: a 10-scene commission for the Buffalo City Hospital children's auditorium entitled *Circus*. In 1936, he received the James Carey Evans Memorial prize in the 3rd Annual WNY Exhibition at the Albright Art Gallery for his oil painting *New England Port*. Sisti held a teaching engagement at The New York School of Applied Design for Women from 1939 to 1940. He also taught at the Albright, and in schools in Ontario, Canada, all while maintaining his own school in Buffalo.

During World War II, Sisti worked for Bell Aircraft, drawing and painting visual training aids detailing construction and installation. Over 100 of his drawings were on display during Bell Aircraft's 30th Anniversary in the mid-1960's, and in a one-man show in Florida in 1966.

In 1955, Sisti opened his own art gallery and studio space at 469 Franklin Street. That same year, he helped organize the first Allentown Arts Festival in Buffalo. The Sisti Gallery hosted diverse artists from around the world. He was an extensive collector of other artists' works, notably Charles Burchfield, and in 1979 donated many items from his personal collection to the Burchfield Art Center.

In 1981, Buffalo honored Sisti by naming a public park for him Franklin and North streets. Tony Sisti died on December 15, 1983, survived by his wife, who died soon after.

Scope and Content

The collection is divided into three series: Personal, Photographs, and Professional work. The majority of the material focuses on Sisti's artistic career and the shows held at his Sisti Gallery. The collection is predominately photographs.

Series I contains a small collection of personal records including correspondence, Sisti's travels to Italy, and his involvement in community organizations.

Series II consists of photographs and negatives documenting Sisti's personal relationships and interests, artwork, and travels. Numerous photos of the Sisti Gallery show building renovation and art shows. Photos are loose, with the exception of six small snap shot albums. *Note:* Photographs originally found with other material can be found in Series I and III.

Series III is comprised of Sisti's professional work and is divided into 4 subseries: Art, Sisti Gallery, Teaching, and Boxing.

The majority are black & white, about half are negatives. Box 1 and 2 include photos approximately 5 x 5 to 8 x 10. Box 5 is smaller photos; most are approximately 3.5 x 3.5. Note: Photos are also in Series I and Series III, as originally found with related material.
